The University of Washington based Pediatric Environmental Health Specialty Unit (PEHSU) along with the Departments of Pediatrics and Environmental and Occupational Health Sciences offer a 2 year EPA sponsored fellowship in reproductive and pediatric environment health. The fellow will develop a broad knowledge base of environmental health topics with directed mentorship from long standing Northwest PEHSU co-directors, Drs. Karr and Sathyanarayana. Core components of the fellowship will include development of skills in environmental medicine clinical consultation, patient education, outreach, and risk communication. At the end of training, fellows will be prepared for clinical, public health, and advocacy based jobs in reproductive and pediatric environmental health. The fellowship provides a stipend and tuition for obtaining a Masters in Public Health at the University of Washington School of Public Health.

For consideration, applicants must provide transcripts, a curriculum vita or resume, 3 letters of reference, and a 1-2 page narrative statement. The Applicants must demonstrate 1. Graduation from an accredited school of Nursing, Medicine or Osteopathy; 2. Completion of the National Board of Medical Examiners Steps 1, 2, and 3 (USMLE for MD, Complex for DO); 3. Completion of a one year ACGME-approved internship (DO, MD). Completion of a primary care residency (e.g. Pediatrics, Family Medicine) is strongly encouraged, but not required.
